

Teams are trying to figure out who will be Earth's next superhero. There are 26 candidates. Over the course of the game, teams will determine each superhero's ...

- Alter ego
- Home constellation
- Weakness

At the end, a panel of judges will eliminate all but one superhero, who will be crowned champion.

The steps in this game are **gated,** i.e. teams must prove that they've done the work in one step before moving on. Each gate is a **creative task**. There are <u>no wrong answers</u>, but if you feel that a team hasn't put in the effort, you may push back a little bit, and suggest they try harder.

Part A

- At the end of Part A, they get this message: FOR THE NEXT PACKAGE SAY SHAZAM
- When a team says that, give them permission to open envelope 02.

Part B

- At the end of Part B, they get a message to GIVE YOURSELF SUPERHERO NAMES.
- There are 8 blank name tags where they can write their new superhero names.
- Ask everyone to say their superhero names. If some folks demur, that's fine.
- Then give permission to open envelope 03.

Part C

- At the end of Part C, the get the message WHAT WOULD YOUR SUPERPOWERS BE?
- Go around the table and ask for their answers.
- Then give permission to open envelope 04.

Part D

- At the end of Part D, they are told to INVENT NAME FOR YOUR SUPER TEAM.
- Have them write this down on the poster.
- Then give permission to open envelope 05 (the white one).

Finale

• Eliminate 25 superheroes. The remaining one is the winner (see final page for answer).

Your jobs

Confirm each step

- Each time a team solves a memo, spot check the answers. (See following pages.)
- Confirm the creative tasks. (See page 1.)

Keep them on track

If teams are falling behind, feel free to give them some answers. The slideshow on the big screens in the room will give a sense of the pace, so teams will be able to tell you if they feel they're behind.

Hints

Walk around and make yourself available for hints. Every so often, ask every team how they're doing, and if they need a nudge.

Confirming

You may always confirm when a team is doing something correctly.

However, if a team is struggling, you may then also tell them where they're wrong. (But don't do that if a team is doing well.)

General purpose hints

Feel free to deploy these early and often:

"Tell me what you know."

"READ EVERYTHING. Almost every word and design is important."

"Stuck? Show it to a teammate."

"You don't need to guess. Every solution will be clear when you get it."

Part A

Process

- Teams are told to <u>put the superheroes in order.</u>
- Solution: alphabetize by Superhero name.
 - There's one name for every letter of the alphabet.
- Then, turn each **price** into a letter of the alphabet
 - See table below for a guide
- In order, they get this message:
 - FOR THE NEXT PACKAGE SAY SHAZAM



Common sticking points

- They try to order by price.
 - "But some prices are the same. Look for something that's unique."
- They try to use price to extract a letter from the name:
 - o "Nope, it's simpler than that."
- They don't notice that the first letters are unique.
 - o "Look for something that's unique among the superheroes, that you can sort by."

Hints

- "How many covers are there?"
- "What are the lowest and highest prices? Does that range sound familiar?"
- If they need help converting numbers to the alphabet, remind them they have an alphabet in front of them (the comic books, in order), but you can also use this table to help.

Part B

Process

- Keep superheroes in alphabetical order.
- Use taglines to find a short "middle name".
 - It fit in the blanks.
- Attach it to the end of the first name and the beginning of the last name to make new words.
 - o e.g. MAY "OR" PHAN = MAYOR / ORPHAN
 - Sometimes the words are used phonetically
 - E.g. CAN "NEW" TONNE = CANOE / NEWTON
- Match up each new "middle name" with a publisher
 - OR goes with Conjunction Comics
 - NEW goes with Ultramodern Comics
 - o etc.
- Use the dot count on each name tag to extract a letter from the superhero's name
 - o 2 dots on CAN TONNE means take the 2nd letter of **Agent Ticktock**, which is a G.
 - Put a G on the first blank of the message, since Agent Ticktock is first in order.
- Answer is GIVE YOURSELF SUPERHERO NAMES

Finally, they must write each alter ego name on the back of each card. Don't let them forget!

Common sticking points

- Not sure where to start.
 - Point them to May Phan, and ask "what do you call the leader of a town? What's an abandoned child called?"
- Not sure which spelling to use for some words (like MAIN / MANE).
 - o Tell them "You'll figure it out on the next step. It's ok to guess for now."
- Not sure what to count into.
 - Tell them to re-read the memo.

Part C

Process, part 1

- Match constellations to supers by finding the exact shape of a constellation in one of the cover designs.
- Keeping the comic books in alphabetical order, lay the constellations on top of them.
- Use the thin letter in each constellation name to read a message.
- DRAW EXTRA LINES / THEN ASSEMBLE
- At this point, they <u>must write</u> the constellation name on the back of each card. Don't let them forget!

Process, part 2

- Each drawing has two hidden star shapes in it.
 - e.g. see Agent Ticktock's shapes to the right
- Find the two star shapes on the corresponding constellation, and draw a line between them.
- The line will cross through a single letter.
- Write that letter on the planet in the corner.


Process, part 3

- The 26 cards make a giant jigsaw, using the space background.
- Arrange them together,, then read the planet letters in order. They spell...
- WHAT WOULD YOUR SUPERPOWERS BE

Common sticking points

- They start guessing thematic connections (like pairing the guitar constellation with the singer)
 - "You'll know a match is right when you get it. The memo tells you to consider shapes."
 - "You're looking for the exact constellation shape within the comic book illustrations."
- They can't find matches
 - Point out Laissez Frere's background
 - Point out Boozi's upside-down heart.
 - "Often, the constellation is in the negative space between objects."
- They don't know what <u>DRAW LINES</u> means.
 - o "Look for something in the illustration that would tell you how to draw a new line in the constellation."
- They don't know what ASSEMBLE means
 - "What part of the constellation cards haven't you used yet?
 - "Look at the spaceships." (They're the easiest place to start.)




























































































































Part C, constellation jigsaw




Part D

Process

- The poster has lines connected to 26 body parts.
- Every one of those body parts can be found hidden inside the tagline for a superhero.
 - E.g. **X Marker**'s tagline is "His Forte: Headbutts!".
 - Hidden in that phrase is FORTEHEAD, which is the word FOREHEAD with an extra T.
- On the poster, wrote the extra letters in the proper boxes.
 - E.g. write a **T** on the box attached to the line that extends from the forehead.
 - They can position the card next to the poster, at the end of that line, if they want.
- Do the same for all 26 superheroes.
- Read clockwise from top right to get the message:
- INVENT NAME FOR YOUR SUPER TEAM





Finale

Process

- Each of the 25 judges has something in common with one* of the superheroes.
- A judge's category is a hint about how their commonality works.
 - E.g. Kind Folk = categories. ("kind" means "category")
 - o E.g. Similar Starts = starts of names
- For most judges, the commonality will have to do with all 3 properties written on the back of the card.
 - e.g. **Daisy Marigold,** who is in **Kind Folk,** has a name that is 2 flowers. One of the superheroes has a flower alter ego, flower constellation, and flower weakness..
 - o Answer: Grunk Hunk
 - aka WARF **ROSE**
 - from DESERT **LILY**
 - weakness IRIS
- Eliminate all matches, and one superhero will remain: Cuddle Lover!
